Message

As we enter our 9th year, the A. G. Leventis Gallery looks ahead with the advantage of lessons learnt: with a better knowledge of our audience, a more profound understanding of the particular opportunities of the region in which we operate and a versatility that comes as an aftermath of the pandemic – an outcome of the alternative thinking we employed as we strove to remain approachable, relevant and 'open' throughout this difficult time.

2022 was a year full of challenges as we worked to return to a regular operation mode after over two years of intermittent closings, restrictions and measures. Striking back, we prepared a programme targeted to keeping the dialogue with our visitors open through a flexibility of avenues. We kept up with our digital offerings, with several online events and digital activities, including educational programmes, lectures and even digital exhibitions – but we matched this with an exciting programme in the Gallery itself, comprising striking temporary exhibitions and a series of events and activities, aiming to incite our public to return to the normal rhythms of regular visits.

Opting for visual splendour and inclusivity, our temporary exhibition titled *Synergy: Art into Fashion* was targeted to introduce a new type of thematic and to promote a visual experience that would bridge two disciplines – high art and popular culture, painting and fashion. Showcasing creativity, the exhibition, which opened in spring 2022, focussed on the symbiotic relationship between art and fashion, exhibiting selected works from the A. G. Leventis Gallery Collections alongside contemporary fashion creations. A powerful visual combination working on many levels of interpretation, the show succeeded in bringing large audiences to our doors – including

many first-time visitors; a considerable success which helped to reverse the reduced post-COVID visitor numbers, but also (and more importantly) to increase our outreach beyond our traditional public.



2022 — Another Year Full of Digital Activities

The A. G. Leventis Gallery's curatorial and administrative staff took steps to design policies in order to prepare a digital action plan for 2022.

Digital Action Plan

We restructured our social media and digital approach with the visitors/audience. This necessary measure was taken to keep constant and continued dialogue with the public through a series of mainly digital activities and actions once the Gallery reopened to the public. An additional budget was available for this purpose.

Our Action Plan during 2022

- Ensure daily operations, even with restricted opening hours or opening with time slots for a limited number of visitors.
- Put the Collections online. We are now associated with Smartify. This is a digital platform that makes museums accessible to a global audience through innovative technology and engaging storytelling.
- Coordinate with collaborators both in Cyprus and abroad.
- Reinforce our activities on the AGLG website and social media platforms.
- Organise virtual tours (Facebook/Instagram Live). Many museums regularly offer livestreaming tours of their collections and exhibitions, often hosted by curators or museum directors. This represents an amazing means to increase engagement with behind-the-scenes looks and to reach a broader public.
- Pinterest/Instagram curated exhibitions. These
 are great platforms to display the Collections and to
 experiment with associations and connections that
 are often difficult in the real world, due to logistical
 or conservation issues.

- Inaugurate podcasts. Podcasts are a rising trend in the museum world. They are economical, incredibly diverse and can be easily enjoyed while commuting or to keep you company while at work or at home.
- Engage our audience with hashtags and social media content. Hashtags are content aggregators: the AGLG can use them to invite the audience to follow a story or a series of posts focussing on a specific topic.
- Encourage sharing. The AGLG should encourage professionals and institutions to share their knowledge and experience, their personal stories in relation to the Gallery's Collections and the history of European art.
- Quizzes and contests. Quizzes are a cost-effective idea to combine information sharing and audience engagement. Contests and competitions are a fun way to encourage the audience to engage with the AGLG's Collections and exhibitions and to reinterpret them with a personal touch.







Synergy: Art into Fashion

14 April – 26 June 2022 Extended until 28 August 2022



In the midst of the ongoing pandemic, the A. G. Leventis Gallery maintained its optimism for the future, celebrating its first eight years of operations with an exhibition presenting for the first time haute couture and fashion statement creations inspired by works from the A. G. Leventis Gallery Collections.

Titled *Synergy: Art into Fashion*, this exhibition invited and challenged viewers to revisit works of art from the AGLG Collections and to rediscover them from a different angle. These paintings influenced the distinguished Cypriot fashion designer Kika Ioannidou and the entrepreneur and textile collector Maria Neoptolemou, whose mutual love of fashion led to a creative dialogue with the Gallery's Collections.

Their synergy manifested during the pandemic and has continued ever since. Haute couture garments created by the two friends, all exclusive and exceptional, are the outcome of a creative process that had the A. G. Leventis Gallery Collections as its starting point and its main source of inspiration. Their effort was supported and encouraged by the internationally known fashion editor and fashion curator Filep Motwary, head curator of this unique

exhibition, which constituted a celebration of artistic creativity centring on the love of beauty and artistic harmony.

The exhibition can be seen as a hymn to the intrinsic relationship between art and fashion. These extraordinary garments stand out for their design, colour and style; and the exhibition as a whole was for all of us, lovers of art and fashion, an opportunity to explore the synergies between these two forms of creativity and to make up our own mind about the famous quote from Pop artist and fashion illustrator Andy Warhol: is it true that 'Fashion is more art than art is'?

Ioannis Kissonerghis -Depicting Female Sensuality

18 May - 18 September 2022

This exhibition was organised in recognition of the agreement between the A. G. Leventis Gallery and the grandchildren of Ioannis Kissonerghis, Antony Georgiou, John Georgiou, Michael Georgiou and Maria Mouskides, who have graciously lent their collection to the Gallery on a long-term basis. The Gallery's debut online exhibition, entitled *Ioannis Kissonerghis: Depicting Female Sensuality*, became a reality in the autumn of 2020. The exhibition touched on this other aspect of the landscape artist's oeuvre, based on creations inspired by or copying works by well-known painters of the second half of the 19th century and the first half of the 20th.

Continuing in this direction, we also wanted to present these largely unknown works by Kissonerghis in a real-time exhibition. Thus, mythological subjects and depictions praising the female body and soul were displayed for the first time to the public of Cyprus at our Gallery. In the Claude Monet Hall, in the Coco_Creativity Centre, the two curators of the exhibition, Eleni S. Nikita and Katerina Stephanides, unfolded this interesting, yet unexplored theme of this pioneering Cypriot painter.

Travelling Exhibition:

Victor loannides: Reflections on the Sea

27 May - 26 June 2022

This small exhibition, in collaboration with the Victor N. Ioannides Foundation, focussed on the artist Victor Ioannides's paintings of Limassol harbour and boatyard, created between 1959 and 1980. It was part of our series of exhibitions showcasing the first generation of Cypriot artists. After Ioannis Kissonerghis, Ioannides is considered the second Cypriot landscape artist who painted *in situ*, with the difference that he embraced the lessons of Impressionism.

After the success of the exhibition at the Coco_Creativity Centre (13 October – 5 December 2021), we were approached by the Victor N. Ioannides Foundation to transfer this exhibition to the Municipal Art Gallery, Limassol, with the support of the Limassol Municipality.

Kochinohoma - Red Soil

20 September – 9 October 2022

The collaborative exhibition *Kochinohoma – Red Soil* told the story of the illegal killing of migratory birds in Cyprus through a post-mortem inquiry into the unfortunate way they meet their end. The timing of the exhibition was intentional, as birds in their millions leave Europe to seek the milder climates of Africa during winter. To these migratory birds that fly thousands of kilometres to their wintering grounds, Cyprus offers refuge along the way. For many, however, this route turns out to be fatal.

This interactive contemporary exhibition was a particularly successful one, which attracted a new crowd to the Gallery.

Digital Exhibition:

La Collection

During the French presidency of the Council of the European Union in the first half of 2022, the A. G. Leventis Gallery was invited to join a digital exhibition coordinated by the presidency, inspired by the Folies du Parc de La Villette, designed by the architect Bernard Tschumi. The innovative Micro-Folie project is supported by the French Ministry of Culture and coordinated by L'EPPGHV, with a group of national operators. Following the success of the first Micro-Folie opened in Sevran in January 2017, the Micro-Folies are being rolled out throughout France and abroad, in accordance with an agreement with the Ministry of Culture signed on 21 March 2017.

All Micro-Folies aim:

- to bring the territories to life, to create new spaces for the people. Each Micro-Folie is intended to be a place of conviviality and exchange, which can take the form of the creation of an associative bar and/or a space dedicated to children;
- to offer everyone the masterpieces of the greatest cultural institutions and to facilitate access to works of art for remote audiences by disseminating their content via the Digital Museum. The Digital Museum is an application that brings together several hundred masterpieces from cultural institutions and museums to be discovered in digital form, making up a unique virtual art

- gallery, combining visual arts, design, architecture, live performances and scientific content. In addition to the Digital Museum, a virtual reality space can be set up;
- to encourage creation, by allowing local artists and inhabitants to perform within the Micro-Folie network through the provision of a fully equipped stage.

The A. G. Leventis Gallery participated with a selection of works from the Paris Collection.

George Pol. Georghiou -Timeless Cyprus

23 November 2022 – 26 February 2023

With the exhibition *George Pol. Georghiou – Timeless Cyprus*, the A. G. Leventis Gallery underlines its firm commitment to the promotion and study of Cypriot art history. This temporary exhibition, along with the research and publishing programmes of the Gallery, highlights an important aspect of the recent art history of Cyprus, with special reference to the first generation of modern Cypriot artists. In this context, the exhibition and the volume that accompanies it offer the public and researchers alike the opportunity to discover new perspectives in Georghiou's works.

On the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the death of the pioneering Cypriot artist George Pol. Georghiou, Rima Outram and Aristodimos Finiefs, the artist's heirs, proposed to lend a large number of works, which were recently returned to the artist's family from Famagusta through the exchange negotiated by the Bi-communal Technical Committee on Culture. Their suggestion was to present them under the title *Timeless Cyprus*. The exhibition was enlarged to include a number of paintings from private and public collections, exploring the Cypriotness of Georghiou's work and his relationship with Famagusta and the people of Cyprus.

Through the images he created, Georghiou has become a part of the contemporary history of Cyprus. His large emblematic works, which were trapped for over 40 years in his birthplace of Famagusta, are becoming more widely known. It is clear that his oeuvre is now identified in the public consciousness as indicative of the way in which Cypriot history and culture have been depicted and more deeply understood.



Parallel Exhibition:

Timeless Cyprus - Life is Short, and Art Long

23 November 2022 – 26 February 2023

The parallel exhibition *Timeless Cyprus – Life is Short,* and Art Long, held in the Claude Monet Hall, in the Coco_Creativity Centre, reflects our respect and admiration and narrates Georghiou's love for his homeland, his city and his world.

This complementary exhibition was the unintended consequence of a purposeful event, in this case, a road trip. As part of the research the A. G. Leventis Gallery team undertook for the preparation of the *George Pol. Georghiou – Timeless Cyprus* exhibition, it was decided to photograph the places where the artist had once lived and painted in his hometown of Famagusta.

The team also conducted interviews and gathered written testimonies from the few people who can still remember moments and encounters with Georghiou. These intermingled with the sensations and feelings experienced during their visit to occupied Famagusta in the process of their own quest into the artist and his habitat (then and now). This resulted in the creation of a special and unique exhibition, which offers a similar experience to visitors – a glimpse through multiple lenses, layers of memories – as well as a chance to live their own journey of meeting the artist George Pol. Georghiou and experiencing his Cyprus.

Creative Workshop: Deconstruction

(February-March 2022)

A collaboration between the University of Nicosia and the A. G. Leventis Gallery

An educational and research programme of creative movement and play developed by the University of Nicosia (Department of Music and Dance, Department of Pedagogical Studies and Department of Architecture). This pioneering programme was inspired by the painting The Bird of Mesarka by Christoforos Savva. In this workshop the participants had the opportunity to explore the context and meaning of the painting through movement and the use of objects, as well as the 3D and floor/ vertical perspectives. The workshops created for the programme applied to different age groups: kindergarten (3+), accompanied by their parents; primary school kids; teenagers; and teachers and adults. Teachers were also given the opportunity to participate in a training workshop, at the end of which they received educational material for future use.

At the end of the programme there was a presentation held at the A. G. Leventis Gallery announcing the workshops' results.




A Trip Up and Down through Time: An Interactive Theatrical Performance to Celebrate International Museum Day (May 2022)

Digitally: Meditation with Art (January-May 2022)

A series of monthly short meditation videos inspired by the paintings of the A. G. Leventis Gallery with museum educator Theodora Demetriou

Music and Theatre Performance: 'Αφηρημένη' [Abstraction] (April 2022)

This choreographic work was presented at the A. G. Leventis Gallery and communicated an artistic dialogue between body, music, images and space. The inspiration came from the painting by Christoforos Savva entitled The Bird of Mesarka, which is exhibited in the Cyprus Collection of the Gallery. Both the content of the painting and its style are interesting; more specifically, in choreographic research the points that constituted the initial stages of experimentation are the patterns presented in the painting and the materials, as well as the title itself. At a later stage, a more creative approach was taken, after exploring possible scenarios that arise by observing the painting, such as the time, the mood, the meaning of the flight and the bird's perspective, always within the Cypriot context in which it was created and which relates to the present day. In addition, an important element that was included in the artistic research explains where the painting is displayed and the dialogue created with the work that dominates that space (The World of Cyprus by Adamantios Diamantis), taking into account the time of their creation. Through construction as well as the way in which the spectators were placed, a 'bridge' was created, where the above are always evolved through movement/choreography and music in order to see the relationship between the two. The play was presented by a dancer and two musicians on stage with the use and interaction of the stage space.

The project was sponsored by the 'Politismos' Programme of the Cultural Services of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports and Youth and was supported by the A. G. Leventis Gallery. Entrance was free of charge.

The workshop is divided into three parts: in the first part, we introduce the painter and the theme; in the second part, participants follow a guided meditation which is inspired by the chosen painting and its theme; then, in third part, participants draw and share their experiences.

The workshop is also provided for free for the organisation Caritas Cyprus once a month.




Art Therapy Pilot Programme (October-November 2022)

The A. G. Leventis Gallery piloted an innovative programme of art therapy for the elderly. The programme was implemented through the collaboration between the A. G. Leventis Gallery, the Cyprus Art Therapy Association and the Nicosia Municipal Multifunctional Foundation and was facilitated by art psychotherapists Marina Ioannou and Eleni Petridou Bouriti.

The goal of the programme was to promote social interaction and self-expression in order to enhance mental health and wellbeing through group art psychotherapy and involvement through using works of art from the Collections of the A. 
Live Drawing: A Portrait of the Mona Lisa 11-20 March 2022

LONG-TERM LOAN

The A. G. Leventis Gallery Collections have been enriched with a new long-term loan of important works of art by Adamantios Diamantis (1900-1994).

Diamantis is considered as one of the pioneers who set up the basis of contemporary Cypriot art. He studied in London at the Saint Martin's School of Art (1920-1921) and the Royal College of Art (1921-1923). Upon graduation, he split the First Prize for Drawing with his fellow student Henry Moore. He taught art at the Pancyprian Gymnasium (1926-1962) in Nicosia. He spearheaded the creation of the Cyprus Folk Art Museum and was its first director (1950-1994). He developed his own style through the study and unrestricted use of different artistic idioms.

The Gallery has had close connections with the artist's family since 2013, when his monumental work *The World of Cyprus* returned to Cyprus; it is now exhibited in the Cyprus Collection Gallery.

In 2018 the Gallery organised a temporary exhibition dedicated to this pioneering Cypriot artist. *Agonies – Diamantis* focussed on 'Agonies', the important series of works from Diamantis' oeuvre, exhibited together for the first time in their entirety. The exhibition featured the eight emblematic paintings Diamantis created from 1963 to 1977. It also included *Woman with Outstretched Arms*, the final complete work by the artist, made in 1983-1984. It is considered to be the conclusion of the 'Agonies' series, as well as of Diamantis' artistic journey, which lasted almost the entire 20th century. In contrast to *The World of Cyprus*, in 'Agonies' the protagonist is the woman in the role of the mother.

The 'Agonies' series explores the artist's relationship with all the important events that marked his homeland in the 20th century. In the political situation taking shape in Cyprus, Diamantis could see

dangers lurking which he discerned would not allow a lasting peace on the island. With his life and art always having been irrevocably bound with the world and destiny of his native land, he felt a great anxiety which was constantly growing and which, inevitably, would be reflected – as an outlet or as an exorcism - in his work, especially in the 'Agonies' series. In his 'Agonies', Diamantis attempted a major break with his artistic career up until then, by drastically renewing his pictorial vocabulary. In order to better serve the subject matter of his paintings, but also propelled by an ineffable concern to keep up with the spirit of his era, this artist, who had tried for years to fight the general current and to remain independent by resisting the new movements in art, was finally led to change his style of painting. He introduced expressionist vocabulary, bold symbolism in terms of form and colour and Cubist references, while he refused to be bound by realistic constraints.

In 2021 the grandchildren of the artist decided to entrust on a long-term loan to the Gallery some of their grandfather's works, including some related to the 'Agonies' series.





DONATIONS 2022

On the occasion of his exhibition and recent publication *The Abandonment and Decay of the Cyprus Landscape*, the prominent architect and watercolour artist Andreas Philippou follows on from his two previous acclaimed works. He focusses on preserving – in glorious illustrations – the island's past: the culture, heritage and history that are reflected in the now crumbling constructions of old. As a testimony to a long friendship with the Leventis family, Mr Philippou donated 12 watercolour drawings depicting views of important Byzantine and Post-Byzantine churches on the island.




Synergy: Art into Fashion





Titian: Themes and Variations

Taking its cue from recent discoveries regarding the AGLG's Baptism of Christ, its attribution to the studio of Titian and the suggestive story of its reused canvas, the Gallery was planning in 2020 to join international partners in co-hosting a symposium in London, dedicated to new research on Titian, his circle and his times in light of new technological advances benefitting art history. The conference was cancelled due to the pandemic. Nevertheless, the A. G. Leventis Gallery, in collaboration with Peter Humfrey, Professor Emeritus in the School of Art History at the University of St Andrews and a leading authority on Venetian Renaissance painting, and Giorgio Tagliaferro of the University of Warwick, prepared the book Titian: Themes and Variations, published by Mandragora and now ready for international distribution.

b) the art-historical interpretation of such findings – the ways in which new discoveries inform our understanding of Titian's oeuvre and the workings of his studio, but also the role of patronage and the artist's choices of media and techniques;

c) the museological potential of such findings – the ways in which such material can be presented to the broader public, potentially adding layers of meaning to the interpretation, presentation and display of paintings.



FORTHCOMING PUBLICATION

Jacquelin de Montluçon: A Painter in Bourges and Chambéry in the Late Middle Ages

Due to COVID-19 conditions and the cancellation of the Jacquelin de Montluçon exhibition with the agreement of all the collaborators, the AGLG has proceeded as planned with the preparation of the publication, in English and French, which will now accompany the virtual exhibition.

Professor Frédéric Elsig is the editor and coordinator of the publication, which includes the following essays: 'The History of a Rediscovery' by Frédéric Elsig; 'The Provenance of the Panels' by Antonia Coca, Ana Debenedetti, Myrto Hatzaki and Ludmila Virassamynaiken; the fascinating analysis of the Louvre research laboratories under the title 'Jacquelin de Montluçon in the Laboratory' by Elisabeth Ravaud and Gilles Bastian; and 'The Commissioning and Reconstitution of Two Triptychs' and 'The Question of the Painter' by Frédéric Elsig. Finally, Sandra Barberi, a specialist on the history of Savoy, has contributed an essay on 'Cultural Exchange and Artistic Mobility in the Duchy of Savoy during the Last Quarter of the 15th Century'.



FORTHCOMING EXHIBITIONS AND EVENTS



Beauty and the Beast: From Ariadne to Andromeda

Beautiful heroines and their beastly fates, stories of lovers true and false, take centre stage in this exhibition which explores mythology through visual imagery, across the centuries of art history. From a 16th-century marble figurine of Andromeda, to Mersad Berber's *Ariadne* and to Jennifer Saint's *Ariadne*, visual and literary references are juxtaposed with contemporary feminist re-readings, helping us investigate new interpretations of age-old stories, heroines and dramas.

Wooed, abandoned, rescued or betrayed, vulnerable heroines of Greek mythology are entangled in stories that relate to the very essence of human relationships. Focussing on Ariadne and Andromeda, and the juxtapositions of true and false lovers, this exhibition casts an eye on the way in which ancient Greek myth, traced through centuries of Western art, touches upon the great traumas of love, sacrifice and treachery, casting female heroines at the heart of the tumult. How does art history respond to the notion of vulnerable femininity? In view of recent interest in both stories, of Ariadne and Andromeda, by feminist literary writing, is there room for a re-reading of these two seminal ancient heroines that sees beyond the image of damsels in distress?

Asia Minor Exhibition - Cypriot Reflections

Following the success of the monumental exhibition at the Benaki Museum in Athens in collaboration with the Centre for Asia Minor Studies, and on the occasion of the centenary of the Asia Minor Catastrophe, an exhibition will be presented focusing on the Greek refugee population that settled in Cyprus.

The exhibition will have three parts: it will first offer a glimpse into the glory and culture of Asia Minor; then – through the national archives and newspapers of Cyprus – it will record the way in which the media of the island represented the events of 1922; and finally, it will present stories, historical artefacts and items related directly to the population that began a new life in Cyprus.



Kanthos - The Impact of the Turkish Invasion

On the occasion of the 30th anniversary of the death of the prominent Cypriot artist Telemachos Kanthos, an exhibition is being prepared in collaboration with his family to present the impact of the Turkish invasion of 1974 on his work. He stopped using very bright colours, and his paintings were then made only in a muted palette of mostly pale brown and black. As he mentioned several times in his memoirs, the invasion completely changed his vision and his work. 'How could I continue drawing,' he said, 'since for me drawing is a song. And I could not. I drew only the difficult years, so only engravings in black and white.'

Archives of Christoforos Savva

A catalogue of all of the documents and material included in the archives of Christoforos Savva, one of the pioneers of contemporary Cypriot art, is now complete. The Curator of the Cyprus Collection, Eleni S. Nikita, and Curator Katerina Stephanides are now studying in detail each document in order to prepare a publication and an exhibition in 2025 dedicated to this unknown aspect of the artist as collector, as friend of various prominent personalities and as a researcher into new techniques.









Through a series of activities, including press conferences, lectures and fundraising events, the A. G. Leventis Gallery offered its premises to these non-profit humanitarian organisations in order to present their work and targets and for fundraising events.

Red Cross - Synergy Fashion Show

A very successful and unique fashion show took place on the occasion of the preparations for the temporary exhibition *Synergy: Art into Fashion*. More than 300 people attended, and all the proceeds were given to the Cyprus Red Cross Society – Nicosia Branch.

Cyprus Anti-Cancer Society

A press conference was organised to promote the fundraising campaign. The Gallery offered the amphitheatre and the lobby area for this event.

Visitation and Patient Welfare Council of Archbishop Makarios III Hospital

All the proceeds from the La Nuit des Impressionnistes concert were given to support the Council's fundraising campaign for a new operation theatre at the children's hospital.







THE AGLG SHOP

The year 2022 began with a rocky start, as Anastasios G. Leventis Street was closed for cars for a period of ten months, with construction works taking place. The positive side was that the improvement of the street would also attract visitors to the Gallery and, of course, to the AGLG Shop.

We saw this as a challenge and chose to proceed with the campaign 'The More You Shop, the More You Earn!', offering a small discount for customers who would shop in-store for the period of the construction works.

Using social media – Facebook, Instagram and the e-magazines *MadameLeFo* and *Madame Figaro*, we managed to create new connections and new clientele and to increase our sales significantly in comparison to last year.

To put this into numbers: the turnover of the period January-September 2022 showed an increase of 147% compared to the corresponding period of 2021.

Actions that helped increase sales:

- The Shop remains open beyond its usual working hours when the Gallery hosts openings of exhibitions or lectures.
- Tour guides were trained to point out the publication or items available in the Shop related to the theme of their tour.
- We chose to apply our special offers only during weekends, when the Gallery has more traffic.
- We combined our AGLG activities, workshops and temporary exhibitions with items from the Shop with the motto 'Did you like it? Take the exhibition with you!'
- We always pay particular attention to our customers' preferences and then buy accordingly. The results of our surveys show that our customers choose: 41% gifts, 17% publications, 13% home, 12% various and 10% jewellery.







FRIENDS ASSOCIATION


The Leventis Municipal Museum of Nicosia and the A. G. Leventis Gallery Friends Association
